Program Goals

The SMK After School Program has been structured to provide students with additional learning and enrichment opportunities beyond what might otherwise be available to them. This is an academic enrichment program, not a day care! We help students:

- Increase core competencies and comprehension in mathematics, English language arts, science, and social studies.
- Engage in intellectually stimulating and personally interesting projects and activities.
- Prevent loss of recently learned skills and knowledge.
- Feel a greater connection to SMK and the local community.
- Have fun while learning.

Daily Schedule

The program meets weekdays from Monday-Friday at SMK Elementary School. The program will begin at 3:15 p.m. and end at 5:40 p.m. Our daily schedule is as follows:

Snack 3:15-3:25 Homework 3:25 – 3:50 Recess: 3:50 – 4:15 Enrichment: 4:15 – 5:30 Pickup and Late Bus: 5:30 – 5:40

Transportation

Students may be picked up by authorized caretakers as listed later in the packet. A late bus will leave the school at 5:40pm Monday-Friday.



Program Staff

The SMK After School Program staff is comprised of a program coordinator, support staff, enrichment staff, student volunteers, classroom teachers, counselors, and volunteers.

Family Engagement

Parents of accepted students are required to attend a Parent Orientation meeting, on November 8, 2018, at SMK Elementary School from 5:45-6:30, prior to the start of the After School Program. Parents are encouraged to participate once a month in any of our enrichment activities. Parents, if you have a skill or talent you would like to share with the program please let a staff member know.

Program Expectations

Students are expected to:

- Bring a positive and enthusiastic attitude to all activities.
- Maintain regular attendance and be on time.
- Demonstrate respect towards staff, scholars, and themselves.
- Follow all school and program rules.

Parents/guardians are expected to:

- Encourage regular attendance.
- Review and respond to updates and communications from program staff.
- Recognize scholars for effort and progress.

At the SMK After School Program we are committed to providing a safe environment for after school and summer enrichment programming. We guide behavior to:

- Promote positive youth behaviors.
- Increase self-management strategies.
- Foster healthy relationships between staff and students and among peers.
- Encourage a deep understanding of the principles of fair play and the rights of all responsible individuals within a democratic society.

Behaviors listed below will not be tolerated within the program. These behaviors may result in immediate suspension or expulsion:

- Bullying verbal, written, or physical
- Harassment
- Possession of any articles determined to be dangerous
- Physical violence (battery) or threats of violence (assault)
- Willful obscene, abusive, or profane language or gestures
- Use of cell phones or tablets during program hours without permission.
- Malicious destruction of, damage to, theft or unauthorized possession of school, program or personal property.

Every behavior incident is reported daily by staff to program coordinators. Serious issues are logged. Depending on gravity of behavior issues, the following actions may be taken:

- Student/Staff Discussion
- Student/Coordinator/Parent Discussion
- Student/Coordinator/School Administration Discussion
- Suspension from Program
- Expulsion from Program
